ÅRSRAPPORT FRA

ST. CROIX LANDMARKS SOCIETY

Dear Fellow Members and Friends,

So many good and unusual things have come to pass over this past year, it gives us great pleasure to recount some of this year's high spots to you.

Perhaps the most heartening and spectacular development of all for the island has been the success of our Open Space land saving program now in its second year of existence. It was made possible by an act of the Virgin Island legislature under a bill signed by Governor Evans, a year ago August, giving private non-profit organizations the opportunity of preserving for historic and ecological use property which both citizens and visitors will be able to enjoy. Under the guidance of Mr. Thomas W. Richards, President of the Nature Conservancy of Washington, D.C., an initial gift by Mr. and Mrs. Clayton Shoemaker of their historic Little Princess Estate was made. This has been followed by the deeding of 19 acre egret nesting area on Salt River. In addition to this, all island residents and friends were delighted to hear of another very generous donation of 153 acres from Cramer's Park to East End Point being made to the Virgin Islands Government by fellow members of Society, Mr. & Mrs. Fairleigh Dickinson.

This was followed in November by us being given more than two acres of land in the Carlton area by a resident who wishes to remain unamed. There is another ten acre tract with unique ruins that we may soon have. The second member of our present board is arranging his affairs so that his spectacular home and grounds will eventually revert to the Nature Conservancy. There are several other persons who have indicated interest in donating land, and if this beginning is an indication of the feelings of our members and friends, our open space program will be successful beyond all expectations.

Our special interest is the performance of Whim Great House, despite a general falling of tourism in the Caribbean, our admissions and receipts have been holding their own. The smooth working of Whim's operation is due in large measure to the devotion and interest of Mrs. Peggy Wall, Mrs. Gwen Kendall and our splendid corps of hostesses.

One of the rewards of a research project begun last Spring on St. Croix's steam mill factory era, which replaced wind and animal power, has been the rediscovery intact of two old steam engines dating back to the late 1840s. Even more remarkable was the fact that although both engines have been under a dense canopy of tropical vines and undergrowth for all these years our expert, Mr. Franklin Beltrande, tells us that they actually could be placed again in running order. Our next large project will be the removal of one of these steam engines and its installation on the steam engine footings which are still standing at Whim.

The garden club has very generously provided funds for us to put in a planting of sugarcane at Whim between the windmill and the Great House. This project is under the supervision of Priscilla Hilder, and the ground preparation is donated by Roewin Equipment Company.

Members will be interested to learn of a very recent publication entitled "Caribbean Cookery" being put out by Time, Life Inc. It contains a beautiful four page color spread on Whim.

The full-scale, well illustrated history of St. Croix entitled, "St. Croix Under 7 Flags" by Florence Lewisohn is now published and can be ordered from Whim or your bookstores.

Landmarks was fortunate in being able to secure through the interest and contributions of Mr. & Mrs. Robert Graff and Mr. & Mrs. Walter Lewisohn 59 extraordinary original drawings and watercolors done by the Rev. Henry Morton on St. Croix in 1843 and 1844. In these he documented many of the old Estates, portraits of some of their owners and the vivid life of the plantations during the period. Such unusual material should lend itself beautifully for both publication and exhibition purposes. With this plan in mind a complete photographic record has now also been made of that once in a lifetime find.

A Caribbean Arts and Crafts documenting and collecting project, now in its second year, is well underway. A sampling of the first results can be seen on display of this loan collection in the former Custodian's Cottage at Whim.

The Board wishes to thank all those very hospitable homeowners and everyone who participated in again making our fine Annual House and Garden Tours such an outstanding success.

The year 1970 saw the Society rebuild the Plantation Museum and double its entire exhibit area. We placed on permanent display the Danish West India Society's show entitled the "Danish West Indies in Old Pictures." This splendid gift comprises 30 double-sided panels with 185 pictures covering 250 years of Danish influence in the Caribbean.

The Whim dining room has received a remarkably fine Sheraton gaming table presented to the Society by Miss Mary Gilbertson.

We were able to save from an old building about to be torn down at Estate Friedensborg the primitive sculpture of a mermaid hewn out of a large block of coral. It now graces one of the outside walls of the cookhouse.

The windmill fan blades have been replaced with new reinforced blades and the top of the mill repaired and repainted.

## HEINRICH ANDREAS RAUPACK

Fortchef og depotforvalter i Christiansted, kaptajn Heinrich Andreas Raupack, blev født på Mandal, St. Thomas i året 1813. Han tog sin afsked i året 1878 og døde i København 1882. R. af D. & DM. Billedet viser ham som ung løjtnant i 1833.

Kaptajn Raupack var en elegant og spændende personlighed. Som ungkarl havde han især damernes bevågenhed, men var i almindelighed populær blandt sine mange venner og bekendte, som ofte skrev "Poesi" til ham.

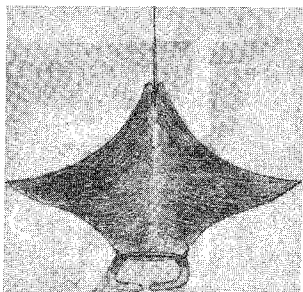
Blandt hans efterladte papirer findes en del af de portrætter, som han med talent og ynde tegnede af personer, som den gang levede på øerne. Til damerne tegnede han motiver til deres håndarbejder og monogrammer til lommestørklæderne.

Morsomme og interessante ting gjorde han notater om. For eksempel opmålte og tegnede han en "Sea-devil", som blev fanget på "Frederikssted Rhed". En anden sjov sag var et fruentimmertermometer, som også blev fundet blandt hans papirer.



### The Sea-devil

Denne Fisk - kaldet "the Seadevil" - blev fanget på Frederikssted Rhed af en amerikansk Capitain, Mr. Hankok. Tre store Baade brugtes til denne Fangst. Dyret blev hugget med Harpuun, og blev truffen paa venstre Side henimod Halen; kun med Møle fik man Bugt med dette monstreuse Dyr. Hosstaaende Maal ere nøiagtig tagne:

# Evans: V.I. First Elected Governor



Dr. Melvin Herbert Evans, who on January fourth took the oath of office as the Virgin Islands first elected governor, is a native Crucian, born in Christiansted on Aug. 7, 1917, just a few short months after the United States acquired the islands from Denmark.

The son of Charles and Maude (Rogiers) Evans got his early schooling at the Christiansted Public Grammar and Junior High Schools. He then went on to Charlotte Amalie High School, where he got his first taste of public speaking as valedictorian of his graduating class.

Evans then set his sights on medicine as a career, and enrolled at Howard University in 1936. He was graduated from there magna cum laude in 1940. He went on to the university's Medical School

and received his degree with honors there in 1944.

The future governor did his medical internship in New York City, returning to his native St. Croix to become physician-in-charge of Frederiksted Municipal Hospital. He held this position until 1948, when he left for Washington as senior assistant surgeon in the U.S. Public Health Service.

In 1950, Dr. Evans returned to the islands to resume his post at Frederiksted Municipal Hospital. The following year he was appointed assistant commissioner of Health for the Virgin Islands and chief municipal physician for St. Croix.

In 1956, the doctor was appointed a Fellow in Cardiology at Johns Hopkins University, the prestigious medical school in Baltimore. He returned to St. Croix the following year, and in 1958 was named Commissioner of Health for the Virgin Islands, a post he held until 1967 when he entered private practice.

In 1966, Dr. Evans took a year's leave of absence from this post to secure a Master's Degree in Public Health from the University of California at Berkeley.

Dr. Evans' progress to Gov-

ernor Evans may be said to have started just a couple of months before the 1968 elections when he, previously a registered Democrat, switched his registration to the Republican Party. After Nixon's victory over Humphrey, the Republican President predictably accepted the resignation of Democratic Governor Ralph M. Paiewonsky, a Kennedy and Johnson appointee, in February 1969.

Government Secretary Cyril E. King became Acting Governor and months of speculation over who would be the last elected governor followed, highlighted by the withdrawal from consideration for reasons of ill health by Nixon's original appointee, former Comptroller Peter Bove.

Evans finally emerged as the President's selection on June 13, 1969, and he took the oath of office as the islands' last appointed governor on July 1 from Chief Judge William H. Hastie of the Third Circuit Court of Appeals.

Opinion was almost unanimous then that Evans' term would be brief, and that today would see him being replaced by a governor elected from either the ICM or Democratic parties. However,

Evans gained the unopposed nomination of the Republican Party, edged out Democrat Alexander Farrelly in the general election, and then emerged the winner over the Independent Citizens Movement's Cyril E. King in the Nov. 17 runoff, with the support of Democratic leaders.

The Governor has been active in many professional associations, among them the American Medical Association, American Public Health Association, American Association of Public Health Physicians - of which he is a charter member, the National Medical Association, and the Pan American Medical Association.

He is chairman of the Board of Trustees of the College of the Virgin Islands, a member of the Board of Directors of Good Hope School, a charter member of the Rotary Club, and has served as chairman of the Board of Medical Examiners, president of the Virgin Islands Medical Association, and chairman of the Governor's Commission on Human Services.

Governor Evans is married to the former Mary Phyllis Anderson, and they have four sons. He attends the Wesleyan Church of St. Croix and is a member of the Masonic Order.

# Virgin Islands' First Lady



**MARY PHYLLIS ANDERSON EVANS**, known to her friends as Phyllis, was born Feb. 1, 1921 in New York City. She attended schools in New York and received her B.A. degree from Hunter College in 1941. She later went on to earn her R.N. from Harlem Hospital School of Nursing in 1944. She was married to Gov. Melvin H. Evans on Aug. 16, 1945 in the Methodist Church in Charlotte Amalie, St. Thomas. The Evans' have four sons who are presently attending schools on the mainland. Mrs. Evans is a member of the St. Thomas Business and Professional Women's Club and the American Nurses Association. She is an avid stamp collector.
